\checkmark Day 1: Picton \rightarrow Westport

- Visit Cape Foulwind (short walk to a seal colony)
- Marvel at Punakaiki Pancake Rocks & Blowholes
- Sunset stroll along Hokitika Beach

Where to Stay:

- Hokitika Holiday Park
- Seaview Lodge & Camping Ground

3 Day 3: Hokitika \rightarrow Franz Josef

Today brings you deep into glacier country.

What to Do:

- Visit Hokitika Gorge (bright turquoise river)
- Stop at Lake Matheson (reflection of Aoraki on a clear day)
- Short walk to Franz Josef Glacier Lookout

Where to Stay:

- Rainforest Retreat (Franz Josef)
- DOC Campsite at Otto/MacDonalds

\square Day 4: Franz Josef \rightarrow Haast

This drive takes you through some of the most untouched rainforest in the country.

What to Do:

- Detour to Fox Glacier or Lake Gault Track
- Stop at Knights Point Lookout
- Walk to Ship Creek (dunes and kahikatea swamp)

Where to Stay:

- Haast River Motels & Holiday Park
- DOC Pleasant Flat Campsite

🌄 Day 5: Haast → Wānaka

Cross the scenic Haast Pass, a highlight of the trip with waterfalls and alpine views.

What to Do:

- Stop at Thunder Creek Falls and Blue Pools Walk
- Picnic at Lake Hawea Lookout
- Explore **Wānaka town** or relax by the lake

Where to Stay:

- Wānaka TOP 10
- Lake Outlet Holiday Park

L Day 6: Wānaka → Queenstown

Take the Crown Range Road (if weather permits) for one of Aotearoa's most scenic drives.

What to Do:

- Visit Cardrona Hotel (iconic pub stop)
- Enjoy views from Crown Range Summit
- Arrive in Queenstown your alpine adventure base

Where to Stay:

- Queenstown Lakeview Holiday Park
- Driftaway Queenstown (for a premium camper stay)

🗩 Day 7: Explore Queenstown

Round off your trip with a relaxing or adrenaline-filled day — your choice!

What to Do:

- Walk the Queenstown Gardens
- Ride the Gondola + Luge
- Take a cruise on Lake Wakatipu
- Treat yourself to dinner at Fergburger or Flame Bar & Grill



What to Pack

- Warm layers and waterproof gear (especially for the West Coast)
- Sturdy walking shoes
- Insect repellent (sandflies love the Coast)
- Camera and spare battery
- Swimmers and towel
- Daypack for walks
- Reusable water bottle and snacks

💡 Local Travel Tips

- Fill up on fuel before Haast it's remote
- Drive cautiously on one-lane bridges and winding roads
- Download maps before Franz Josef reception can be patchy
- DOC camps are often first-come, first-served
- Sandflies are worst near water and forest cover up or use spray

Must-Try Local Flavours

- Murchison: Lamb pies at the Murchison Tearooms
- Westport: Crayfish or whitebait (seasonal)
- Hokitika: Hokey Pokey ice cream or a fresh seafood platter
- Franz Josef: Pizza and pints at SnakeBite Brewery
- Wānaka: Big Fig for slow-cooked local meals
- Queenstown: Famous Fergburger and local wine tastings

📌 Need to Know

- West Coast weather can change fast be flexible
- Don't attempt glacier walks without a guide
- Haast Pass has limited services plan breaks
- Rubbish bins are rare on scenic roads pack it out

• DOC sites may not have toilets with paper — bring your own
