# Southern Starlight Trail: 8 Days of Stars, Snow and Sounds

#### **Quick Overview**

Duration: 6–8 Days

Start Point: Ōtautahi – Christchurch

End Point: Tāhuna – Queenstown

• **Best Time**: March – October (for optimal stargazing)

Driving Time: ~12 hours total

Highlights: Dark sky reserves, alpine hikes, majestic fjords

Venture into Aotearoa's southern heartlands on a journey carved by stars and snow. From stargazing in Takapō to glacier hikes and the dramatic soundscapes of Fiordland, this itinerary promises awe at every turn — all at your own pace in a campervan.

## Days 1-2: Takapō - Lake Tekapo

## **Day 1: Starry Beginnings**

- Drive Christchurch to Takapō (approx. 3 hrs)
- Visit the Church of the Good Shepherd iconic photo spot
- Soak in Tekapo Springs Hot Pools under the stars

## **Day 2: Dark Sky Discovery**

- · Slow morning after a late night of stargazing
- Hike up Mount John for breathtaking 360° views
- Book a guided Dark Sky Experience at the observatory

## Where to Stay (Campervan Style)

• Freedom Camp: Lake Pukaki Reserve – stunning starlit views

Campground: Lake Tekapo Motels & Holiday Park – powered sites
+ lake access

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#### Days 3-4: Aoraki - Mount Cook

#### **Day 3: Alpine Glory**

- Drive to Aoraki Mt Cook Village (1 hour)
- Hike the Hooker Valley Track swing bridges & glacier lakes
- Set up for astrophotography under Aoraki's watchful peak

#### Day 4: Glaciers & Legends

- Walk to the Tasman Glacier Viewpoint
- Explore the Sir Edmund Hillary Alpine Centre
- Wrap up with another clear night of star-gazing

#### Where to Stay (Campervan Style)

Freedom Camp: White Horse Hill (DOC site) – at the track start
Campground: Glentanner Park – powered sites and epic views

## Days 5–6: Piopiotahi – Milford Sound

## Day 5: Road to Fiordland

- Drive to Te Anau (4.5 hours) peaceful lakeside base
- Explore the Te Anau Glowworm Caves
- Take a tranquil lakeside sunset walk

## **Day 6: Fjord Wonders**

- · Cruise Milford Sound waterfalls, seals, sheer cliffs
- Stop at Mirror Lakes, The Chasm, and Monkey Creek on your return

· Overnight back in Te Anau for a final southern sky show

#### Where to Stay (Campervan Style)

- Freedom Camp: Fiordland National Park (DOC designated zones)
- Campground: Te Anau Kiwi Holiday Park powered sites + amenities

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## Days 7-8: Tāhuna - Queenstown

#### Day 7: Welcome to Adventure

- Drive to Tāhuna Queenstown (2 hrs)
- Ride the **Skyline Gondola** to Bob's Peak
- Dine on the TSS Earnslaw for a lake cruise + buffet

#### Day 8: Chill or Thrill

- Morning free for shopping or lakeside wandering
- Depart from Queenstown Airport

## Where to Stay (Campervan Style)

- Freedom Camp: 12 Mile Delta DOC campsite (short drive from town)
- Campground: Queenstown TOP 10 well-equipped, close to centre

#### What to Pack

- Warm layers even in summer
- · Camera + tripod for night photography
- Red torch for stargazing
- Sturdy walking shoes

· Rain jacket – especially in Fiordland

## **Travel Tips from the South**

- Check the moon phase for best star visibility
- Fill your tank before leaving major towns
- Expect limited phone signal in remote areas
- Book Dark Sky tours in advance
- Winter driving? Carry snow chains and check roads daily

## **Must-Try Local Food**

- Aoraki Alpine Salmon fresh and melt-in-your-mouth
- Venison stew hearty and warming
- South Island artisan cheese grab some at local markets
- High-country salmon sashimi served with a view
