# Northland Journey: 5 Days from Auckland to Cape Reinga

#### **Quick Overview**

• **Duration:** 5 days

• Start/End Point: Auckland (circular route)

• Best Time: October-April

• **Driving Time:** About 13 hours total

• Highlights: Ancient forests, pristine beaches, Māori culture, fish & chips

Follow the laid-back rhythm of the North as you explore golden bays, ancient trees, and sacred places.

This 5-day campervan-friendly loop offers a beautiful mix of natural beauty, cultural depth, and coastal charm — a perfect slice of **Te Tai Tokerau – Northland**.



Day 1: Auckland to Pēwhairangi – Bay of Islands

#### **Hole in the Rock**

#### Morning

- Depart Auckland early for a relaxed coastal drive north
- Stop at Whangarei Town Basin for coffee, art galleries, and harbour views
- 🚒 Campervan Tip: Fill up with fuel and supplies in Whangārei
- Explore the coastal charm of Paihia, the gateway to the Bay of Islands click **here** to discover cruises, island adventures, and cultural experiences.

#### **Afternoon**

- Arrive in Paihia
- Explore Paihia Beach or unwind by the sea
- 🚶 Sunset walk to Waitangi Bridge stunning in the evening light

#### **Evening**

- Dine at a waterfront restaurant like Charlotte's Kitchen
- 🕵 Enjoy a quiet night walk along the bayfront

### Morning

- **m** Visit the Waitangi Treaty Grounds Join a cultural tour, see a waka, and walk through the Treaty House
- Learn about Māori navigation and storytelling traditions

## **Afternoon**

- Catch the passenger ferry to Kororāreka Russell
- Explore historical sites like Christ Church and Flagstaff Hill
- Visit the Pompallier Mission one of NZ's oldest buildings
- Lunch at The Duke of Marlborough

- A Optional: Twilight sailing around the Bay of Islands
- Each Return to Paihia for the night

# Day 3: Kauri Forests & the Far North

#### Tāne Mahuta

# **Morning**

- ▲ Drive west to Waipoua Forest home of the mighty Tane Mahuta
- Take a guided tour with Footprints Waipoua to learn about the spiritual importance of the kauri forests

#### Lunch

Grab fish & chips at Opononi Takeaways – a local favourite

#### Afternoon

- Continue north toward Kaitaia, soaking in dramatic coastal landscapes.
  Our favourite route is to head to Rawene, take the Hokianga Ferry to Kohukohu, and continue through Mangamuka Gorge and over the hill.
  Alternatively, drive from the ferry terminal up to Ahipara, but be prepared for gravel roads along the way.
- Dunwind at your accommodation or stroll a quiet Far North beach

# Mhere to Stay (Campervan Style)

- Freedom Camp: Awanui close to the road so can be a bit noisy
- **d** Campgrounds:
  - o Ahipara Top 10 Holiday Park peaceful and well equipped
  - Ngapae Holiday Park right by 90 Mile Beach and heading toward Cape Reinga

# Day 4: Cape Reinga & 90 Mile Beach

#### 90 Mile Beach

#### Morning

- Doptional sunrise at Cape Reinga Lighthouse where oceans meet
- **(6)** Walk to **Te Rerenga Wairua**, a sacred place in Māori tradition
- Click here to explore guided tours, including options from Paihia

#### **Afternoon**

- Sandboard the Te Paki Dunes pure fun!
- Reach Drive or join a guided tour on 90 Mile Beach
- Picnic and swim at Tapotupotu Bay stunning and secluded

#### **Evening**

- Stargaze from the beach some of the clearest skies in the country

### 🚜 Day 5: Scenic Return to Tāmaki Makaurau – Auckland

## Tāmaki Makaurau – Auckland City

#### **Morning**

- Visit Kawiti Glowworm Caves magical and family-friendly
- Final scenic stop at **Piroa Falls** before reaching Auckland

- Light rain jacket
- Camera
- Cash for small shops

# **Local Tips**

- Mangonui Fish Shop gets busy between 12-2 pm—arrive early to avoid gueues
- · Book Waitangi Treaty Grounds tours ahead of time
- Clean your shoes at the gate before entering Kauri forests to prevent Kauri dieback
- Fill up on petrol in main towns
- Download offline maps for areas with limited phone signal

• Pros: Quieter attractions, mild weather

• Cons: Potential windy conditions

• Best for: Scenic walks and cultural sightseeing
