



# 7-Day Scenic South Island Road Trip:

## From Waitohi – Picton to Ōtautahi – Christchurch via Whakatū - Nelson, Takaka & Arthur's Pass

Explore the stunning top half of Te Waipounamu – the South Island – on this 7-day road trip from Waitohi – Picton to Ōtautahi – Christchurch.

This route blends golden beaches, creative towns, wild coastlines, and alpine passes. Whether you're driving a rental car or cruising in a campervan, this itinerary offers an incredible mix of nature, culture, and photo-worthy pitstops. Ideal for those who've already taken the Kaikōura coastal route and are after something a little different.



### Quick Overview

- Duration: 7 days
- Start Point: Waitohi – Picton
- End Point: Ōtautahi – Christchurch
- Best Time: October to April
- Total Drive Time: Approx. 16–18 hours
- Highlights: Golden Bay beaches, Takaka's creative vibe, Wharariki dunes, West Coast rock formations, Arthur's Pass hikes



### Day-by-Day Itinerary



#### Day 1: Picton → Nelson

Begin your journey with a scenic coastal drive along Queen Charlotte Drive. Stop for a seafood lunch in Havelock, the green-lipped mussel capital, before arriving in vibrant Nelson.

What to Do:

- Stop at Momorangi Bay or Ngākuta Bay for a stretch
- Lunch at The Mussel Pot in Havelock

- Enjoy Tahunanui Beach or explore local art galleries

Where to Stay (Car or Campervan):

- Nelson TOP 10 Holiday Park
- Maitai Valley DOC Campsite

## **Day 2: Nelson Hike + Day Trip**

Explore the sunny city or take a short road trip to nearby gems like Mapua or Cable Bay.

What to Do:

- Hike the Centre of New Zealand Track or Cable Bay Walkway
- Visit the Nelson Saturday Market (if timing works)
- Optional drive to Mapua Wharf or Founders Heritage Park

Stay: Same as Day 1

## **Day 3: Nelson → Takaka**

Wind over the famous Takaka Hill, soaking up panoramic views before reaching the creative hub of Golden Bay.

What to Do:

- Stop at Hawkes Lookout
- Visit Te Waikoropupū Springs
- Easy walk at The Grove or moderate walk to Rawhiti Caves

Stay:

- Pohara Beach Top 10
- Anatoki Salmon Campground (catch your dinner!)

## **Takaka → West Coast (via Wharariki Beach)**

A longer drive, but packed with highlights. Don't miss the windswept dunes and seal colonies at Wharariki Beach.

### What to Do:

- Morning walk at Wharariki Beach
- Optional: Oparara Arches detour from Karamea (adds time)
- Scenic stops along the Buller Gorge

### Stay:

- Punakaiki Beach Camp
- Charleston DOC Site

## Day 5: West Coast → Arthur's Pass

Continue down the coast before turning inland at Greymouth to cross back over the Southern Alps.

### What to Do:

- Walk the Punakaiki Pancake Rocks & Blowholes
- Visit the short Truman Track
- Stop at the Otira Viaduct Lookout

### Stay:

- Avalanche Creek Shelter (DOC)
- Jacksons Retreat Alpine Holiday Park

## Day 6: Explore Arthur's Pass

Stay an extra night in this mountain village and enjoy a day of hiking and wildlife watching.

### What to Do:

- Hike the Devils Punchbowl Falls Track (1 hr return)
- Stroll the Dobson Nature Walk (easy)
- Tackle the Bealey Spur Track (half-day hike)
- Watch for kea at scenic pull-outs

Stay: Same as Day 5 or Greyneys Shelter DOC Site



## Day 7: Arthur's Pass → Christchurch

Your final day winds through the Canterbury high country. Don't miss a final scenic walk before ending your journey.

What to Do:

- Stop at Castle Hill/Kura Tāwhiti for a short walk among the boulders
- Drive the spectacular Porters Pass
- Drop off your vehicle and explore more of Christchurch if time allows

## What to Pack

- Light layers for sun and rain
- Sturdy walking shoes or hiking boots
- Swimsuit and towel
- Insect repellent and sunscreen
- Power bank and reusable water bottle
- Camera or phone with plenty of storage

---



## Local Travel Tips

- Fuel up in larger towns like Nelson and Takaka – remote areas have fewer stations
- DOC campsites may not have mobile coverage – download maps in advance
- Always check the weather before alpine drives
- Nelson's Saturday Market is one of the best in Aotearoa – worth planning around

---

## Must-Try Local Flavours

- Havelock: Green-lipped mussels at The Mussel Pot
- Nelson: Fresh juice and dumplings at the Saturday Market
- Takaka: Locally roasted coffee and artisan baking
- Punakaiki: Classic fish and chips with a beachside view
- Arthur's Pass: Grab a hearty pie at the Wobbly Kea Café

## Need to Know

- One-lane bridges are common – watch signs and give way
- Castle Hill is sacred – stay on paths and don't climb the boulders
- DOC campsites are usually first-come, first-served
- Alpine weather changes fast – carry warm gear, even in summer
